

How do I choose the right pressure washer for my job?

Electric Pressure Washer vs Gas Pressure Washer

If you're cleaning indoors with an electric pressure washer, you're limited on your energy sources. For instance, indoors you're confined to using an electric motor to drive the high-pressure pump. The electric motor limits your portability because you're constantly tied to an electrical outlet.

Outdoor cleaning provides you with more options. Working outside allows you to operate electric pressure washers or gas pressure washers, the two most popular solutions. Typically, the electric pressure washer models are more economical. However, the gas pressure washers are portable-no electric cord-which may be more convenient.

While most pressure washers are typically fed by a garden hose from a spigot, some can also draw water from a large tank. This makes on-site cleaning easier because of the mobility factor.

How much time do you need with the pressure washer?

If you are operating a pressure washer for less than five hours per week, you could technically get away with a less expensive model found in do-it-yourself stores. But beware-you certainly won't get the service, support or warranty coverage that so many people have come to trust from Hotsy Alberta.

If you are operating pressure washers for less than 20 hours per week, you will find some mid-range models that are typically identified by a direct-drive pump and a barebones design. A mediocre option.
